Lord of the Garden, you created us within the midst of the garden of Life. We recognize our place amidst all of creation. We pray that all humanity will know discernment and the limits of our use of the bounty of the garden. Amen

Silence

Prayer or meditation

Lord of the Seas, great and wide, we give thanks for the innumerable diversity of your creation. We grieve the loss of diversity and pray that humanity will come together to halt the destruction of all species both small and great. Amen

Reading 5. The forests

Ps 96: 10-13

Silence

Prayer or meditation

Lord of the Forests, you have made us to know joy. May we exult with the trees, with the country as we look towards your saving justice and live in cooperation with your action in this world. Amen

Reading 6. Good and Evil

Amos 7: 14-15; 8:4-7

Silence

Confession

Heavenly Father, we thank you for this earth which you have created and we recognise that we are your servant people, created out of the earth itself.

Yet we turn our backs on your creation. Our lives are marked by selfishness and greed. What is meant for good, we have used for evil. We have used and abused this earth, our home. Too often, we take the gifts you hold out to us and use them for our own selfish desires. We trample upon the works of your hands, leaving a

trail of waste and destruction. We give too little thought to the needs of other people, or the needs of your creation.

Forgive us Lord for thinking of ourselves and ignoring the needs of other people, and of generations not yet born. Forgive us for forgetting that everything in the world belongs to you.

Help us to live more simply. Help us to understand that we are part of creation, that we are your stewards in it. And make us instruments of the renewal of your creation. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Declaration of God's forgiveness

The psalmist says

Reading 8. The earth groans

Rom. 8: 18-25

Silence

Prayer or meditation

Redeemer God, we hear the groans of all creation waiting for us to be revealed as your children. We pray that as we work for justice we may also live in hope and eager longing for the redemption of all creation. Amen

Reading 9. Firstborn of all Creation

Col. 1: 15-20 *To be read in unison, all standing*

Silence

Final prayers

**Holy God, Spirit of the Great Dreaming of all Creation
Enliven us to act for justice and healing of this earth,
Inspire us to live lives of simplicity and sustainability,
Break open our hearts to the needs of the earth and her creatures,
Fill us with hope and a burning hunger for your presence and peace. Amen**

Blessing and dismissal

May the blessing of God be within us and amongst us,
May we be a blessing to the earth and she to us.
May we be seeds of renewal and hope.

The Peace of God, the Love of Christ, the Breath of the Spirit
Be with you as you go.

Notes

It would be helpful to include visual images in the service: possibilities include slides of master paintings on the themes for each reading, photographs of creation relevant to each reading, displays of local material representing creation or creative work in the district, etc.

We urge those using this service with hymns to use the modern rather than the traditional alternatives offered.

The address, if there is to be one, should be after the last reading and before the final prayers.

The 'Prayer and meditation' sections may consist simply of the set prayer as a response to the reading or, in some or all cases, include more extended material. A period of silence to allow time for personal reflection on the reading, before the prayers, is important.

The approach to this service could be celebratory, or contemplative. This will be largely set by the nature of the music used. To this end two forms of music are included: a set of possible songs and hymns plus a set of chants. Obviously a mixture of the two forms can be used. Other music or a combination of styles could also be

used. (TIS; *Together in Song*, TW, Trisha Watts and Gabriel Lord, *Sanctuary: where heaven touches earth*).
